Jerrod is the host of The Vortex - Enter The Vortex Sundays from 9:00 PM to 10:00 PM for a mind-bending journey through psych-rock, cosmic country, and cumbia. Tune in, turn up, and blast off.

## Five Questions with Jerrod

*What do you like best about volunteering at KLKT?*

I love contributing to a community driven project and having the opportunity to share my taste in music on the air. Preparing for the Vortex each week keeps me discovering new (or new to me) bands and diving back into bands I played on repeat in the past but haven't listened to in a while. I also enjoy working the KLKT table on First Fridays and seeing the enthusiasm people have for community radio whether from Lockhart or out of town. It's really cool to see the growth in listeners now vs the first time I worked a KLKT table.

*How would you describe your program to someone who has never listened to it?*

The Vortex is psychedelic music broadly defined, so I pull from modern psych-rock, old school acid rock, cosmic country, garage, cumbia, zamrock, and try to throw in some unexpected tracks now and then. I play music from the late 60s up to new releases, and feature artists from around the world. So tune in and see where the music takes you.

*What is your favorite KLKT program?*

I'm probably biased as a Sunday programmer, but I really dig our Sunday lineup. If I had to pick one, I'd say Labyrinths. I think that program really shows the power of community radio because I always hear something (multiple things) that I'm totally unfamiliar with and would have a hard time finding exposure to without that show.

*Can you share your favorite music or radio specific memory?*

I have many, one that always comes to mind is my first Utopiafest in 2015. The whole atmosphere was just incredible, super-talented bands, and the crowd was really focused on the music, making for a great experience. Seeing a full line-up of great bands, many I'd never listened to before, in a remote location was just awesome, and changed the way I think about music festivals and started my appreciation of the smaller independent fests.

*Anything else you would like to share?*

I want to encourage people to join the KLKT community by tuning in and volunteering. It's pretty wild to think the station is just one year old and feels like a core part of what makes Lockhart unique. I'm just happy to be a part of it.
