

Five Questions with Chris

What do you like best about volunteering at KLKT? I get to talk to locals and out-of-towners about our diverse programming and they usually resonate with one of the programs we offer. Many people support what we are doing and find it refreshing that there is another streaming option that is based in Lockhart.

How would you describe your program to someone who has never listened to it? British Academy plays bands and musicians that originated from the UK. I usually get a weird stare then I tell them I play bands from The Beatles to

modern day. They usually understand that, but then something special happens. The person usually starts listing bands they know (Elton John, Oasis, The Cure, etc.) and I confirm that, yes, I do play those bands on my show.

What is your favorite KLKT program? Too many to choose from, it depends on my mood. Normally The Vortex is my go-to. Feel Good Frequency plays the bands my family likes. Inner Frequency is good to chill out to. For the classics I tune into Study Hall. Two Five One is growing on me in a good way. I like Alternate Route on good days and Password on bad days.

Can you share your favorite music memory? Spring 1982, sitting on the curb waiting for the bus one girl is sitting near me listening to her Walkman. She smiles and asks if I want to listen, I say yes and hear Duran Duran for the first time. Mind blown. Thanks, Amy, for introducing me to British Pop.

Anything else you would like to share? I have two set themes for every month. The first Sunday I showcase a band and play 3 or more songs from them and every third Sunday I pick an era or time period and play songs from that time.
